


Fall is here, and building season has been BUSY! Just a few short months ago, on a cold day in January, we celebrated Groundbreaking with Sarah and her family and friends. Today,the volunteer crew is wrapping up the flooring and will begin hanging doors!

What does it take to get this far?

For starters, it takes time - volunteers at the job site have so far put in over **seven hundred and fifty** hours into building this home - Sarah and her friends and family have worked for nearly **four hundred hours**.

Secondly, it takes materials - we are grateful to the many vendors that provided much needed items, including Chambers Construction, Eagle Plywood Specialties, Seneca Sawmill, Hull-Oaks Lumber, Bonn Roof Care, Balanced Electric, Inc, and the Carpet Gallery.

Lastly, it takes money - our generous donors and sponsors have provided more than \$50,000 this year in support of affordable housing in the tricounty area.



The family has also put in numerous hours towards building the home and has learned a lot along the way. We are proud to be working with such great people!

Our repair program has had a successful year and completed two entire roof replacements for veteran families that needed some help. We have built a new porch for a family in Harrisburg so that they now have safe entry into their home along with fixing some windows, replacing a water heater, fixing a leaking bathroom and installing 3 wheelchair ramps that were very needed. We are always applying for more grant money and asking for donations so that we can continue to help our families and our community, so..... don't forget to help us if you have a few extra dollars that you would like to use to make a real difference in someone's life!

Here at Habitat we will continue working hard for our communities and I would like to thank everyone involved in making a big difference in so many people's lives. I am so proud to work with our staff who have gone above and beyond during such extreme circumstances. Our volunteer construction crew has been building homes for the last 25 years and I can't put into words how proud I am to call them all friends. They have taught me a lot along the way and have made me strive to be a better person because of all that they do. A Letter from The Executive Director

Hello Friends,

In August, I accepted the position of Bilingual Executive Director at Junction City Local Aid, after working as a grant writer since 2018. In that time, I have come to know Local Aid and broader J.C. as a heartfelt, hardworking, and dedicated community. I truly appreciate the warm welcome I have received in the community, especially from Habitat for Humanity Restore, Grocery Outlet, the Tri-County Chamber of Commerce, and Local Aid volunteers, staff, and clients.

An open-shopping food pantry, we prioritize choice, accessibility, and inclusivity around food choices and related basic needs services for all who seek our service—including during the pandemic.

A bit about Local Aid: a FOOD for Lane County pantry and a United Way agency, we also partner with a variety of local and regional organizations and groups, including Habitat for Humanity, Grocery Outlet, the J.C. School District, houses of worship and community centers, and mental health and community service providers. We operate year-round with four staff, 50+ volunteers, and an active Board of Directors; no appointment or documentation of any kind are required to access our services. An open-shopping food pantry, we prioritize choice, accessibility, and inclusivity around food choices and related basic needs services for all who seek our service—including during the pandemic.

For individuals, families, and organizations like Local Aid, the past two years have been challenging in unanticipated ways. Yet despite these very real challenges, the Local Aid team rose to the challenge—and we continue to do so today! Our home delivery service, COVID-19 safety measures, new volunteer recruitment and training, expanded Board of Directors, and first bilingual staff position in our organization's history all support our mission of providing food, clothing, and related basic needs assistance to individuals and families in Junction City and the surrounding rural areas.



We have been busy here at the ReStore. We are processing donations daily. Currently we have Christmas set up as you enter the store. Brenda, Nikki, and Karen have worked hard to make the shop look beautiful. Stop by to see all the beautiful Christmas decor we currently have in the store.
